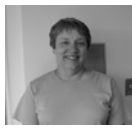

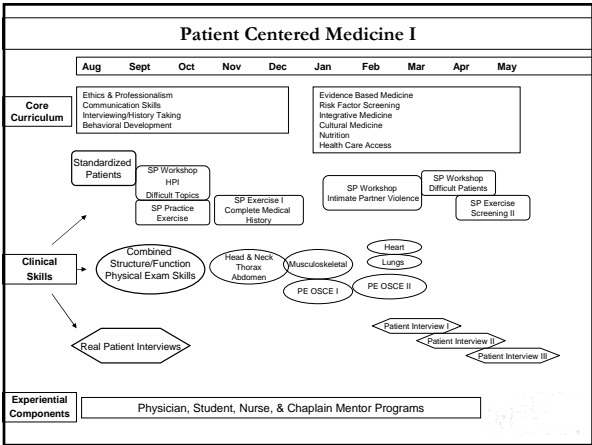

- Assigned to Maywood Community-Based Loyola Family Medicine Clinic
- 1 Year Commitment
- Will Work ½ Day a Week as a Patient Care Technician
- Will Learn Procedures
- Will Learn from Practicing Physicians



C8

- The "C.A.R.E. 8"
- CARE – Community Advocacy through Relationships and Education
- Facilitators: Eva Bading, M.D., Paul Hering, M.D., and Mark Stoltenberg, M2
- Pilot Group with focus on building community among service-driven students through direct interaction with local underserved families



C8

- 1 Family per 2 students after two months of comprehensive training
- 1 year commitment, but optional 4 year opportunities
- Intentionally matched mentors and informal "service nights"
- Co-author a large-scale service grant application and possibly present at a national conference
- Share in the daily realities of underserved medicine together with other dedicated classmates
