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Video OSCE MSE

- 1st day of Psych MSE
- Describe what you observed
 - Pertinent positives
- Describe pertinent items you looked for but did not observe
 - Pertinent negatives
- 9/35 points-25.7% of exercise

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Video OSCE Differential diagnosis

- Given diagnosis
 - Based on interview
 - Q: what info supports the dx?
 - Q: what info is inconsistent with, or allows you to rule out dx?
 - 7 questions: (actually 9; 2 are double questions)
- Consider all the DSM-5 criteria for the dx
- Explain your thinking!!
- 9/35 points-25.7% of exercise



Video OSCE Treatment Plan

- 7-8 questions
 - 3-4 have >1 parts: A, B or A, B, C (1 only)
 - How exam is numbered results in 13 questions instead of 7-8
- 17/35 points (48.6%)
- Questions
 - Which med you recommend
 - Reasons for the med you recommend
 - Advantages
 - Disadvantages



Video OSCE Treatment Plan

- Given meds A, B, C; which recommend?
- Advantages
 - Med A-focus on med A; not med B or C
 - Treats pt's delirium & personality disorder
 - Helps normalize HR & BP
 - Makes future delirium less likely
- Disadvantages
 - Side effects: common, serious
 - Only works during winter months



Video OSCE

- In General
 - Read the question carefully
 - If the patient asked you the question, what would you tell the patient?
 - Explain your thinking
 - Be as complete as you can



Video OSCE Another OSCE?

- Evaluation: assessing the value of ideas, things,
- and so on

 Synthesis: assembling a whole from parts
- Analysis: dissembling a whole into parts

- Application: using what has previously been learned
- Comprehension: knowing what a message means
- Knowledge: remembering/recalling


The Psychiatry Clerkship Exam

- 100 questions, 3 hours
- 100 points, ~28% of grade
- USMLE style
 - Clinical vignette
 - Many are 2 step questions
 - From vignette, must make diagnosis & then answer question

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The Psychiatry Clerkship Exam

- Numbers
 - 2016-17 Mean & Standard Deviation
 - Mean 79.7% SD 8.0%
 - Range of scores
 - High scores:
 - 95%, 94% x 2, 92 x 3
 - Low scores:
 - 60%, 62%, 63% x 2, 64%





- From 2008-present
 - **129**+138+142+152+142+139+155+151+157=
 - 1,305 test takers: 17 failures = 1.3%
 - 2016-17: all passed!
- Remediate exam



Are test questions removed from the exam?

- Yes; all students receive credit
- Bad DI & P-value stats
 - P-value < 0.5; especially < 0.3
 - DI < 0; a negative discriminator
 - Statistical information from both past year and individual clerkship looked at
 - 2016-17 clerkships: average 2.5 removed (range 1-5)
- Clerkship # students-small number

- Patient should be counseled regarding which of the following?
- ~22% exam; ~31 questions



Type of Questions

- Pharmacotherapy
- Which of the following is
 - most appropriate pharmacotherapy at this time?
 - drug-drug interaction complication?
 - appropriate next step in pharmacotherapy?
 - most likely complication of the addition of this medication?
 - contraindicated in this patient?
- ~20% exam; ~28 questions



Type of Questions

- Diagnosis
- Which of the following is the most likely diagnosis?
- ~19% exam; ~26 questions



Type of Questions

- Clinical Interventions
- Which of the following is the most appropriate next step in management?
- Which of the following is a priority in management?
- ~16% exam; ~22 questions



Type of Questions

- History & Physical Examination
- Which of the following factor's in patient history most increase this patient's risk for developing his condition?
- Specific additional history should be obtained regarding which of the following?
- ~11% exam; ~16 questions



Type of Questions

- Applying Scientific Concepts
- Which of the following is the most likely explanation for this patient's condition?
- ~8% exam; ~11 questions



Type of Questions

- Lab & Diagnostic Studies
- Which of the following is the most appropriate next step in evaluation?
- Which of the following is the most appropriate to order?
- ~4% exam; ~5 questions
